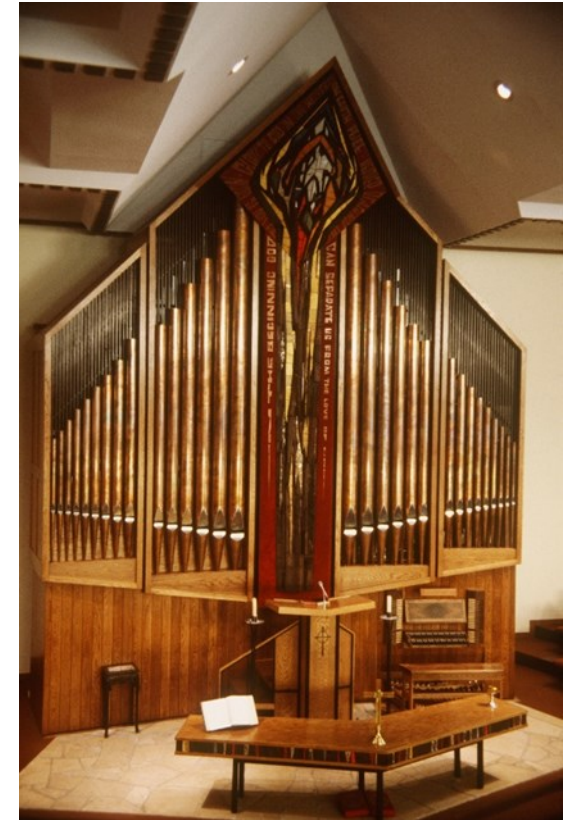

Student Requirements

Students between the ages of 13 and 18 are eligible to apply. Previous organ study is not required, although minimal piano proficiency at the early intermediate level is desired.

Tuition includes housing for five nights, meals (Sunday evening through Friday lunch), transportation to and from all POE events during the week, class materials, POE T-shirt, and a one-year student membership in The American Guild of Organists. No refunds for cancellations will be made after April 30. Enrollment is limited to 22 students.

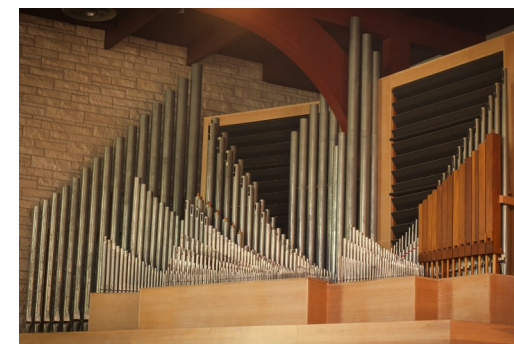
